**A Practical Guide for Teams playing in the ICC Regional Championships**  
(These are to be read in conjunction with the ICC Regulations and in no way replaces them)

**Qualification of Players (Regulation 14)**

- All players must be in good standing with their National Association, and have met the eligibility criteria to represent the County. Players must be current members of an affiliated club through BADMINTON England before they play, or in the case of Irish, Scottish and Welsh regions for a club in those countries. It is the responsibility of the Team Captains/Managers to ensure that all players meet these requirements. Immediately contact your match secretary with any issues.

**The Referee (Regulations 22 & 23)**

- It is the duty of the Referee to be in overall charge of the tie or ties, and settle any disputes. The Referee's decision is final.  
- It is the responsibility of the HOME team to appoint a non-playing Referee for a tie. He/she should make him/herself known to both Team Captains/Managers.

**Constitution of Teams and Ties (Regulations 16, 17, 20 & 21)**

- Each tie will consist two men's singles matches, two women's singles matches, four men's doubles matches, four women's doubles matches and three mixed doubles matches. In the singles events players will play only their opposite number. In the men's and women's doubles events each pair of a team will play each of the opposing two pairs. In the mixed doubles each pair of a team will play only their opposite number.  
- Each team shall be arranged in such a way as to provide two men's singles players, two women's singles players, two men's doubles pairs, two women's doubles pairs and three mixed doubles pairs. The singles players and mixed doubles pairs shall be ranked strictly in order of merit.  
- There shall be no restriction with regard to the number of events for which any player shall play, but the pairs in each doubles event shall be composed of entirely different players. A minimum of four men and four women will be required.  
- Any objections regarding the composition or ranking of the opponents team should be made to the Referee prior to the event being played.  
- Unless mutually otherwise agreed, the order of play in each tie shall be firstly all singles matches, secondly all men's and women's doubles matches and thirdly all mixed doubles matches. The order of play in each of these events shall be decided by the Referee.

**Team Sheet (Regulation 16)**

- Captains shall present the composition of their teams in writing to the Referee at least fifteen minutes before the scheduled start of the tie.  
- The result of every tie in the Regional Championships, together with the full scores of all matches therein and the full names of the players and the required affiliation numbers, signed by the captain or other official of BOTH teams and the Referee confirming the accuracy of the result sheet, shall be sent by the county WHOSE TEAM WERE PLAYING AT HOME to reach the Championships Secretary within five days of the tie.

**Continuous Play (Regulation 21)**

- A player is entitled to at least twenty minutes rest after every singles match, and at least ten minutes rest after any doubles match, before their next match.

**Substitutes (Regulation 17b)**

- A captain shall be entitled to include a substitute for a player nominated in accordance with Regulation 15(b) or Regulation 16(b) in the event of the player having failed to arrive by the time that player is required to play their first match; or, in the event of any player being incapacitated after play in a tie has begun, so that they cannot continue playing, for any subsequent matches in which such incapacitated player should have taken part. The injury or other incapacity must be caused entirely after play has begun and not be due solely to tiredness or the worsening of an existing ailment.  
- The Referee AND the opposing team captain must be notified of the intention to substitute the absent or incapacitated player. An incapacitated player, having been substituted, is no longer eligible to further take part in the tie.

**General**

- Each match shall be the best of three games of 21 points except that if the score reaches 20-all the winner is the player/pair with 2 clear points or whose score reaches 30 first. Rally points scoring shall be used.  
- Penalties (Regulation 31) may be imposed where the Regulations are not followed.

***All players should compete in the spirit of the game, and understand that cheating, verbal or physical abuse, or poor court etiquette will not be tolerated. A card for misconduct may be awarded by the Referee, where appropriate, to enforce this.***
